The Australian Government has committed to a far-reaching new public sector *Public Interest Disclosure Act*, and is currently reviewing private sector whistleblower protection under Part 9.4AAA of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth). The outcome of the Victorian Government Integrity and Accountability Review (the Proust Review) also includes an extensive review of the *Whistleblowers Protection Act 2001* (Vic). Meanwhile, United States whistleblowing laws are also being reviewed, updated and amended. This seminar will give an overview of reform trends in both federal countries and identify key challenges ahead for public, corporate and employment lawyers.
